Double-space your citation list both between and within entries. Some professors may prefer single spaced citations, as we've done below!!! Alphabetize sources by first word of citation. You are not required to provide the URL for Web resources. Your instructor, however, may require this.

Web Publications

When citing information from a Web publication, provide the following general categories of information (include the punctuation, italicization and capitalization).

Author’s Last name, First name. “Article Title” or *Book Title*. Publication information for print version. *Title of Overall Web Site*. Publisher or sponsor of site. (If not available use n.p.) Date of publication. (If not available use n.d.) If page numbers are required (as for anthologies or journal articles) use n. pag. if there is no pagination.
